

It is with very great pleasure that I present the Balance Sheet for Season 1922.

For many years I have endeavoured to provide the Club with a permanent Home, and am now proud to be able to say that it is an accomplished fact. We have a ground second to none in the District. For this, in the first place, we are greatly indebted to our esteemed President Sir Edward Stern, Bart., p.L.; secondly, to our Vice-Presidents who subscribed so generously; and thirdly to the playing members themselves. Also, before Season 1923 commences we shall be in possesion of a Handsome Pavilion, the sole gift of our President, to whom the Club owes a deep debt of gratitude for his munificient gifts.

The first season on the New Ground has proved to be a great success. Our membership has increased from 40 in 1921 to 170 during the past season and subscriptions from £8 in 1921 to the grand total of £66 in the past season.

We successfully ran three Cricket XI's; and five Tennis Courts were available for the use of the members.
