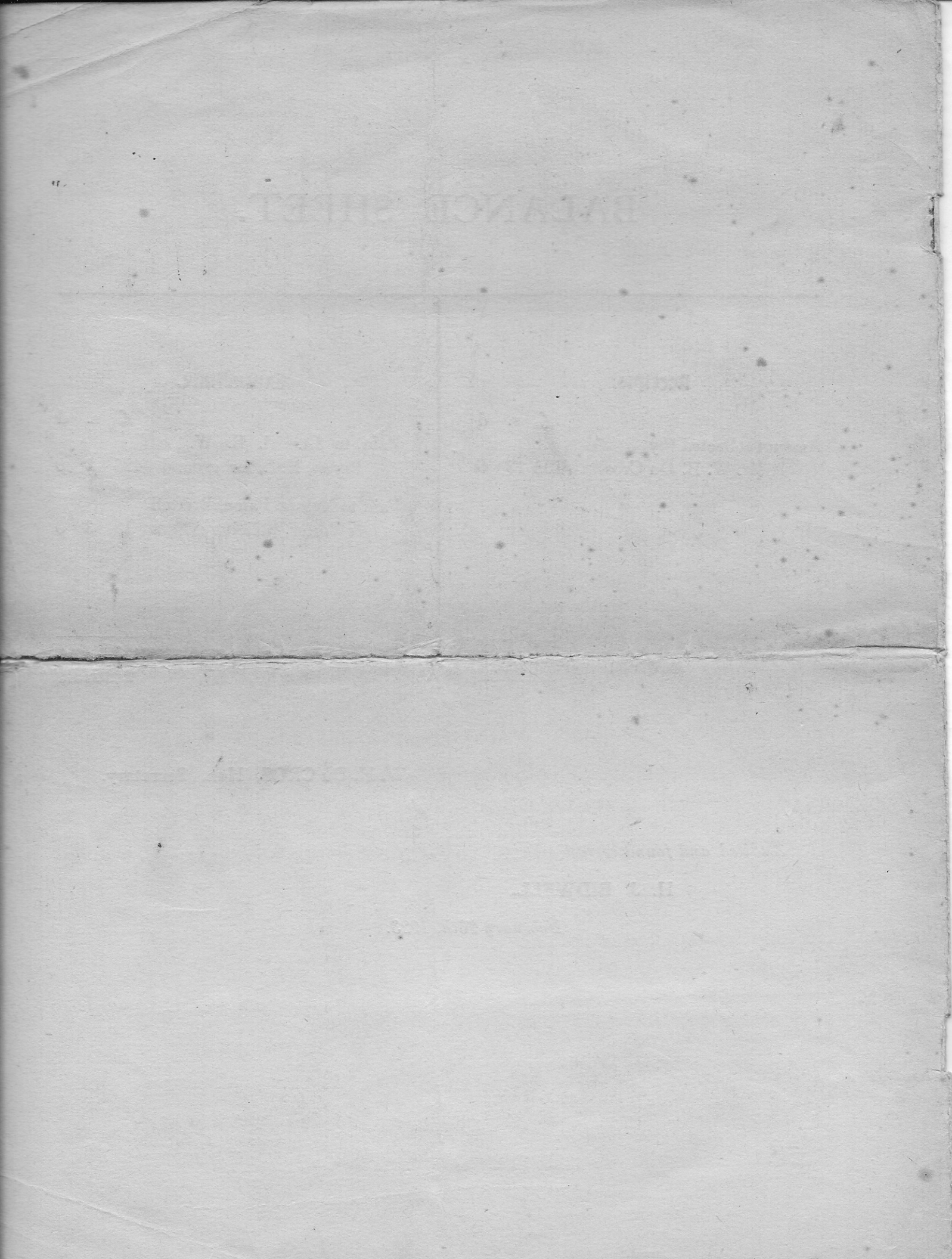

REPORT.

GENTLEMEN,

It is with very great pleasure that I present the Balance Sheet for Season 1922.

For many years I have endeavoured to provide the Club with a permanent Home, and am now proud to be able to say that it is an accomplished fact. We have a ground second to none in the District. For this, in the first place, we are greatly indebted to our esteemed President Sir Edward Stern, Bart., D.L.; secondly, to our Vice-Presidents who subscribed so generously; and thirdly to the playing members themselves. Also, before Season 1923 commences we shall be in possession of a Handsome Pavilion, the sole gift of our President, to whom the Club owes a deep debt of gratitude for his munificent gifts.

The first season on the New Ground has proved to be a great success. Our membership has increased from 40 in 1921 to 170 during the past season and subscriptions from £8 in 1921 to the grand total of £66 in the past season.

We successfully ran three Cricket XI's; and five Tennis Courts were available for the use of the members.

On September 14th we had the honour of a visit from Mr. Andy Ducat and his County XI, thereby enabling us to give handsome subscriptions to both the Chertsey Nursing Association and the King Edward's Hospital, Windsor.

The Cafe Chantant, arranged for August 30th, was unfortunately spoilt by the weather, but a capital time was spent in the Constitutional Hall, which resulted in the addition of £13 to the Club Funds.

The Committee take this opportunity of tendering their most sincere thanks to our esteemed President, Vice-Presidents, and to all those who have rendered the Club service during the past year.
