- Encourage and congratulate players from both teams.
- Recognise and celebrate effort as well as performance.



ENJOYMENT

- Try to be a consistent voice of unconditional support; 'Whatever happens, I love to watch you play'.
- Understand and accept that performances and results will vary from game to game.
- Let them play. Steer away from technical overloads in the form of car journey coaching and boundary edge advice.

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
